


START FUND: DEALING WITH

In 2014, Start Network created the Start Simo It provides rapid financing to underfunded small to medium-scale crises, spikes in chronic humanitarian crises, and acts in anticipation of impending crises, filling a critical gap in humanitarian financing.

The global Start Fund has been a success. Start Network has since used this core model as the basis for a number of related funds.

SFN: Major achievements



- Activation of funds within 56 hours
- Principal activities within 2.25 days



 Onboarding 10 new LNNGOs including due diligence complete



• Direct funding to local organizations as leads

- About 15% fund directly and more than 75% fund indirectly channeled to local NGOs

PROBLEMS WE ARE FACING

Decision-making is centralised and priorities are disconnected from communities

The system is reactive, fragmented and inefficient

Incentives and ways of working are outdated, inflexible and resistant to change

SOLUTIONS

Shifting power and resources, and decentralising decision-making to locally-led networks and organisations.

Building a global financing system that reduces risk, anticipates, and acts ahead of predictable crises.

Incentivising innovative, locally-led and contextual solutions and learning together with people affected by crises.

What is Anticipatory

IFRC

Actional Anticipatory action refers to actions taken before a crisis hits to prevent or reduce potential disaster impacts prior to a shock or before acute impacts are felt. The actions are carried out based on forecasts or predictions of how the event will unfold.

UN-OCHA

Anticipatory humanitarian actions are actions taken in anticipation of a crisis, either before the shock or at least before substantial humanitarian needs have manifested themselves, which are intended to mitigate the impact of the crisis or improve the response.

START Network

- Anticipatory action: acting ahead of predicted hazardous events to prevent or reduce acute humanitarian impacts before they fully unfold. (REAP definition)
- Advanced preparedness to respond (e.g. rapid protection training before anticipated violence/displacement)
- Mitigating loss/harm (e.g. communicate and mobilise before a heatwave)
- Avoiding losses (e.g. de-stocking livestock before a drought)


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The cash transfer before the flood saved us. Otherwise, we would have had to sell our livestock, our income source for the future!

Objectives of FOREWARNT NETWORK

- Connect practitioners with academia
- Increase technical capacity to access and interpret forecast information
- Prioritize and advocate for policies that are proactively addressing disasters
- Standardize disaster response and information generation
- Open doors for non-SFN members to SFN and increase the LNGO engagement in AA
- Creating spaces for members to collaborate/conduct risk analysis
- Cultivating a consistent & reliable expert group that monitors and shares forecasts
- Development of anticipatory action plans - supporting members to access data & with coordination
- Showcasing and discussion of innovations, tools, analysis and anticipatory projects – nationally, regionally, and globally
- Funding and providing technical support to the development of

Roles of FOREWARN experts in A TOREWARN



Pre-alert

- Share forecast information
- Connect with Start Network members planning to raise anticipatory alerts
- Help develop tools that can prompt an alert
- Share EAPs and help with data analyses

During the alert

- Advise on quality/accuracy of forecasts
- Provide information to inform the allocation decision

Post-alert

- Provide input to project reporting and learning
- Technical review of any tools used and recommendations
- Add information and data to the tool to improve it
- Advocate for AA across the disaster





What has SFN done in anticipation of Heatwaves last









What can be done in anticipation of heat waves?

Before a HW

- Mapping out at-risk communities and coordinate activities and funding
- Awareness raising through localized messaging, social media, pamphlets and posters
- Targeted workshops in communities, particularly women, elderly, and children
- Enhance the capacities of health-care professionals and institutions
- Cooling centers and water facilities set up (Water ATMs)
- Reflective-coating of roofs
- Coordination calls among stakeholders

During a HW

- Alerting and Awareness raising continued
- Cash distribution to street vendors, hawkers, subsistence farmers
- Cooling centers and water facilities set up (Water ATMs)
- Distribution of Saline water, drinking water through mobile services, water tankers
- Setting up mobile ambulance services
- Distributing fans in schools, cooled drinking water systems and bottles, slippers, umbrellas
- Thatched roofs on cement to act as an insulation

After a HW

- Monitoring response and identify impacts of the response
- Seek feedbacks regarding the response
- Hold post-heat wave season learning exchange exercises
- Generate evidence on the types of impacts the heat wave had
- Peer-reviews of forecasting tools and services and identifying gaps
